



Prof Filip Stockmans

Professor Filip Stockmans is currently Chief of Hand Surgery at AZ Groeninge Hospital, Kortrijk Belgium. He is a Professor in the Faculty of Medicine at Katholieke Universiteit Leuven. He is also co-holder of the Materialise Chair for Hand Surgery.

Prof Stockmans graduated at KU Leuven in 1988 and pursued a residency in Plastic surgery at KU Lueven. He then did a Fellowship in Hand surgery at University of Louisville, US. In 1998 and 1999 he did his PhD at KU Leuven. He also worked as clinical researcher at the University of Umea Sweden.

He has published on a wide range of topics including cone beam CT scan, 3D printing, wrist and carpometacarpal pathology, trauma and hand reconstruction surgery and brachial plexus surgery. He has published books as well as chapters on topics such as Ulnar-Sided Wrist Pain, Difficult problems and complications at the forearm and Plastic surgery, nerve repair and burns.


TRADE EXHIBITORS


