Dr Hentz is currently Professor of Hand and Upper Limb Surgery in the Department of Surgery and Professor of Orthopaedic Surgery at Stanford University.

He earned his medical degree in 1968 from the University of Florida College of Medicine and completed a residency in General Surgery and Plastic Surgery at Stanford University.

Following a year as a Hand Fellow with J William Littler in New York City, Dr Hentz joined the faculty in the Department of Surgery at Stanford in 1975. He has served as a chief of Hand Surgery Service since 1985.

He is the author or co-author of more than 100 peer-reviewed publications, 50 book chapters and 6 books.

His current research involves the development of techniques for evaluating anatomy and function in damaged or paralyzed limbs and the improvement of surgical procedures to enhance and restore impaired function.






